TITLE: Street News Service Intern

PURPOSE: To aid INSP in supporting its global membership of independent social media by collating, editing, posting, and distributing quality editorial content for exchange through its online news agency, the Street News Service (www.streetnewsservice.org).

SPECIFIC DUTIES:

- *Collate all submissions of news articles, features, and photographs contributed by INSP street paper members around the world.*
- *Select and collate supplemental content from external partners, including Reuters, Inter Press Service, and international NGO bodies.*
- *Format and copyedit all English-language submissions and ensure their applicability to regional and international audience.*
- *Liaise with INSP staff regarding article translations.*
- *Write brief article summaries to aid INSP members in the selection of content.*
- *Upload all material (text and photographs) to the Street News Service website.*
- *Draft and distribute email feeds for each weekly edition, recognising contributors and highlighting notable articles for the 'Editor's Choice.'*
- *Monitor Street News Service usage, as needed*

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

- Strong written communication skills.
- Attention to detail and ability to work well independently.
- Background in journalism strongly preferred.

TIME COMMITMENT: 17 hours per week for at least a 12-week period. Availability on Fridays and Mondays is essential, but hours of work are flexible and can be both office and home-based. Start Date: Monday 2nd February.
